## Structure of No-Limit Texas Hold'em Poker Tournament

DISCLAIMER: These rules will be the structure for the tournament and must be accepted in order to participate. In the event of a dispute the organizing committee will have final say on the outcome.

1. Blinds will change every fifteen (15) minutes before the break, every twenty(20) minutes after:

2. **Re-Buys** – Players will be allowed to re-buy 3 times during the first two (2) hours of the tournament. All re-buys, prior to the break, will cost \$25 and will give the player 4,000 in additional chips. Each re-buy **can only take place when your chip count falls to 1,000 or less. Rebuys must be purchased before the start of the next hand if a player has zero chips**
3. **Break** – Two (2) hours into the tournament, at approximately 9:00 pm, a dinner break will take place until 9:30 pm. An add-on of \$25 for an additional 4,000 of chips will be allowed, regardless of your chip count, prior to the re-start of the tournament.
4. Upon re-starting the tournament, no re-buys will be available.
5. Once a player has lost all of his chips, he/she will be eliminated.
6. Tables will be combined as required based on eliminations.
7. English will be the only language spoken at all tables.
8. During the dinner break organizers will “chip up “ all players. Players with an uneven number will be given an extra chip of the smallest denomination still being used. Ex) 910 will get the player an extra 100 chip.  
Therefore, a player may not be eliminated from the tournament by the chip change process.
9. Raises must be, at minimum, the size of the big blind if this is the 1<sup>st</sup> raise. The next raise must match or exceed that of the previous raise. There is no limit in the number of raises.
9. Split pots with an odd number of chips will have the odd chip go to the dealer.
10. Players **must be seated** when the cards are being dealt to play in that hand. Players not in their seat will be blinded off and not allowed to play that hand.
11. If 2 or more players are eliminated in the same hand and eligible for a prize, the player with the most number of chips at the start of the hand will finish in the higher position. If any players started with the same number of chips, they will split their portion of the prize money equally.
12. When the tournament is down to the number of players matching the prize list or less AND all the players agree to their share of the prize money, play will end. The prize money will be split according to the agreement reached by **ALL REMAINING PLAYERS**.
13. ORDER of FINISH  
1<sup>st</sup> - only player with chips  
2<sup>nd</sup> – last player to lose all their chips  
3<sup>rd</sup>- 2<sup>nd</sup> last player to lose all their chips
